Next Thursday, Steve Blancard's music group will be singing the national anthem at the Fred Nats game.

# Comments on the show

J wanted to make some comments on our recent show. J found the fairgrounds to be an excellent location given that we cannot be downtown anymore.

Complaint that we opened the show to non qualified AACA vehicles. He acknowledged that they were kept off on their own. He counted 30 of those vehicles. But he opposes having non AACA vehicles at our show, and he believes that it will crowd out AACA vehicles. He cited Richmond as an example, where non-AACA are as prevalent as AACA vehicles. He was appalled that the decision was not presented to the general club for consideration. If it was a matter of making more money he felt it was not worth changing the nature of our show. It is not who we are as a club, even if other shows have 'prostituted' themselves to profit off of non-compliant cars at the show. He thinks this is turn off to AACA folks for no gain; we have money in the bank and we will dilute the brand.

Terry- opposed J's opinion. He said it is not about money, it's about attracting new members to the hobby. At the national convention, one of the things talked about was that the national AACA supported exactly what we did to have a bigger tent to attract more people. It's not about money, it's about getting new members.

John Garnett said it will be more difficult to get national award winning cars at our meet. The popularity of the driver participation class is another indicator of reaching out to other hobbyists. It is not easy to get the numbers in Fredericksburg.

Rob Govoni asked if driver participation ever got turned away. They never get turned away from showing, but they may not get the certification.

Steve Blancard – noted that several folks asked about doing a swap meet. Based on Richmond, spaces were 15x30 selling for \$30, 60 spaces available, all sold out. He proposed that we add a swap meet.

Wally mentioned possibility of a car corral as well.

Mark Irving noted that the car show was an AACA show. Non compliant cars were separate, and were not judged.

Lauman – recalled the June 1959 meet where he met the folks that started the Fredericksburg AACA Region, including Edgar Rohr. Lauman became member in 1979. He agrees with J's opinion that non-compliant vehicles should not be welcome at our shows.

He's been struggling with voicing his opinion. He feels that we need better judging, and we need greater participation and education of judges to perform the task. He's had two vehicles that have accumulated tens of thousands of miles just pulling car trailers to shows. He has a plan for judging. We should take about 30 minutes at each meeting to have a school on how to judge a vehicle. He recalled seeing driver quality cars consistently getting 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophies without much effort, beating out several other cars on the field. He'd like to see the club use the AACA judging manual as a guide and take time from our meeting times to train the membership on how to judge a vehicle to AACA specifications. He noted that Model Ts and As were once dominant on the field but as time passed the owners passed and the knowledge and experience of these cars passed.

Wally recommended greater participation in National Meets, especially as a judge to get more familiar with the process. Go to the National Judging Schools held before each meet.

John noted that judging has been a challenge. He added that the judging schools at national meets are free and provide a lot of information. All meets except grand nationals have apprentice judging teams. Judges breakfasts run about \$10.

There seemed to be a general interest in incorporating some of these ideas to increase overall knowledge of the judging process.

Mark suggested that the club purchase 30 judging manuals to pass out to the members to inform them on judging standards. Motion passed.

There is a general interest from new members to learn about old cars, and efforts to provide technical information.

# **New Business – none**

A student from King George High School, Rushi Vatel, was awarded the HFRAACA scholarship. The check was cashed and a thank you received.

Mark mentioned that we still need a caterer for December.

Ben closed the meeting with a prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 8:37 PM.




